I am sitting out on the patio of our guest house resting after our first three-day conference. I am listening to the familiar rhythm of Swahili as Ezekiel and Daniel are discussing how hard it would be to live in the snow that we have in some places in America. The breeze is almost cool in this afternoon and it is good to rest. We are sitting under poinsettia trees, plumeria We have had horrible heat these few days so we are truly enjoying the breeze.



Sanjaranda is a beautiful rural setting with corn fields and vegetable gardens everywhere. The vegetation is very welcome after the long dusty ride from Dodoma. This is where Yohanna serves God. Yohanna Mkulanje is a presbyter in his denomination. He brought together almost 250 pastors and denominational leaders from the area. Baptists, Lutherans, Anglicans, Catholics Inland African and numerous Pentecostal denominations. (As I am sitting here writing a young woman of the staff has been talking to us. Ezekiel our TZ Director and Daniel our Anglican leader began talking to her about Jesus. I had to stop so Evan and I could join in praying as they led her to Christ). What a

moment to see an Anglican and a Pentecostal pastor gently speaking the words of truth to the tender heart of this young woman.

The conference has been so impactful and God has moved. The people are so hungry and eager to know truth and teach their people. From this conference we have been asked to come and bring the teaching to a division of the Anglican church in the area as well as one of the larger evangelical denomination's Bible colleges. They want us to train all of their teachers and they want to use the curricula in there five Bible Colleges.

Evan has been working hard to keep me together. Taking pictures and keeping track of funds and hauling my things around. I love having him here and I can see God using him in ways he may never understand. I am very proud of this young man.

Tomorrow Pastor Curt Pearson joins us. He is a new staff member for Ancient Promise and we are so glad to have him be a part of the team. I am so excited for our teams in Africa to get to know him.
